Biomedicines and Subjectivities is a collective art exhibition. It promotes a dialogue between artists, bioethics, human rights activists, patients, health advocates, and experts in the field of biomedicine. The exhibition explores the impact of biomedicine on subjectivities, bioethics, and biotechnologies in both relationships to the past and future.

We are defining biomedicine as a modern discipline that includes molecular biology, gene therapy and other emerging medical sciences. This new clinical practice understands bodies and minds, and employs biotechnologies to intervene at the cellular, molecular, and other biosciences intervention ... seeking to manage human vital processes or augmentation of life.

The exhibition focuses on artists' interpretations of the impact of biomedicines and subjectivities. Art can be a vehicle to generate conversation about medical treatment, biomarkers, patient activism, new techniques of genetic diagnosis and "prevention." The subjects can explore practices of management of chronic death, the administration of reproduction, the optimization or modification of ones bodies, patient response, traditional healing practices, maximization of life, and much more. Biomedicine can intrigue us to question our notions of identity, normality, and open new practice of injustice such as genetic discriminations, and interrogates the definition of humanity...
